Activity and Life Enrichment Program is Up and Running!

Achieve's most recent Spring Gala's fund-aneed was dedicated to funding an Activity and Life Enrichment Coordinator, and an Activities Fund. The goal of this program is to help provide our participants with

even more life-enriching activities and outings in the community. We are pleased to report that in July we hired the Activity and Life Enrichment Coordinator, Ryan Stoa, and the program has been doing incredibly well. Prior to this role, Ryan had worked at Achieve for over 10 years, and was the Training Specialist in Area Orange.

Since Ryan already had established a wonderful rapport with participants and staff, the implementation of this program has been very smooth. To date, Ryan has started music groups, including karaoke and an Achieve choir, he's implemented a cooking group, coordinated various art projects, and is in the midst of planning future groups focused on exercise, meditation, social skills, and hobbies. He will also be starting volunteer opportunities including Meals on Wheels and Feed My Starving Children, and he'll coordinate weekly outings in the community.

Ryan has been asking for participants' input on what activities they'd like to do. For instance, many participants have shared their love of movies so he's in the process of forming a movie club, with members watching movies and then discussing them. A Yu-Gi-Oh Card game club has started up as well.

"Providing activities that bring joy to our participants has been such a rewarding experience. Many of our participants don't always get these kinds of opportunities, so creating a space here at Achieve where they can try new things and connect with friends is truly special," Ryan shares.

One of the most recent activities Ryan coordinated was an OREO cookie challenge, where about 30 participants taste-tested a variety of unique flavored OREO cookies and voted on their favorite flavor. An OREO cookie bracket was created, and the championship came down to Birthday Cake vs. Chocolate Peanut Butter Pie. The flavor that took the crown was Chocolate Peanut Butter Pie.

Another goal of this Life Enrichment Program is to start a formal volunteer program. More information to come about this, but we're very excited to engage more volunteers.

"A huge thank you to everyone who made this program possible—it's been great seeing our participants dive into new experiences, connect through activities, and share countless laughs together," says Ryan.

On Friday, August 23rd, 2024, Achieve Services hosted a festive 60-year anniversary celebration at its location in the Blaine Human Services Building.

Achieve participants, staff, families, and guests enjoyed a variety of activities including a DJ and dance, karaoke, face painting, temporary tattoos, yard games, a sucker pull with prizes, and a dunk tank. The dunk tank was incredibly popular, as Achieve participants had the chance to dunk eight staff members.

The week leading up to the celebration consisted of a spirit week, featuring: Hawaiian-Shirt Day; Favorite Sports Jersey Day; and a visit from local firefighters from the Blaine – Spring Lake Park – Mounds View Fire Department.

"We are so proud to celebrate 60 years of service to the disability community" said Tom Weaver, CEO of Achieve Services. "Our evolution from serving a handful of children with disabilities 60 years ago, to serving more than 175 adults with disabilities today, would not have been possible without the incredible support we've received from Anoka County and many generous donors in our community. Achieve began in 1964 in a church basement where a few mothers of children who had disabilities gathered and agreed they needed accommodating childcare for their children with special needs.

The concern and advocacy of those parents led to the creation of the DAC (Day Activity Center) preschool (what Achieve was called prior to its current name), for children with disabilities. This program became part of Anoka County.

In the 1970's, the school districts were given responsibility for children with disabilities through age 21, while institutions for adults with disabilities were shutting down. So the DAC preschool changed its name to Achieve Services and began providing day programming and employment opportunities for adults with disabilities age 21 and older. Achieve remained part of the county, specializing in serving those with highly-complex health needs who other programs often declined to serve.

In 1991, Achieve moved into our current location in the Blaine Human Services Building off 89th Avenue and Highway 65, and in 2004 Achieve spun off from the county and became a free-standing nonprofit organization.

Currently, Achieve is serving more than 175 adults with disabilities and nearly half work in the community at 22 different job sites.
